Thomas' Takeaways

In Jesus' "second inaugural address," Jesus keeps up the same focus on justice with a medieval tenacity: Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who hunger now, for you will be satisfied. Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. Blessed are you when men hate you, when they exclude you and insult you and reject your name as evil, because of the Son of Man. Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, because great is your reward in heaven.

What Jesus promises with this odd box of chocolates is justice, a justice prompted by love for God and others. Look at the texts: to the poor he promises "good news," and to the imprisoned, "freedom." To the blind he promises "sight," and to the oppressed, "release." To the poor he promises "the kingdom of God," and to the hungry, "satisfaction." To the mourners he offers "laughter," and to the hated, "rejoicing," "leaping in joy," and a "great reward." In these inaugural statements, Jesus is concerned with restoring humans so that things are just plain right. But he said such things not only in his inaugural statements. At the end of his life, Jesus gives us a clear view of the Judgment Day in the Parable of the Sheep and Goats. As a shepherd separates his sheep from his goats at the end of a day—shooing them into their respective locations so the goats (who are less hardy) can be protected with more warmth—so the Son of Man will separate humans on the basis of who acted justly and who did not. If sheep and goats can be distinguished by a cocked tail (goats), so humans can be distinguished by their treatment of others. "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me."... What distinguishes a follower of Jesus is a Jesus Creed- inspired love that lives out the value of justice for the hungry, thirsty, estranged, unclothed, sick, and imprisoned. From Inauguration Day to Judgment Day, Jesus Creed-justice is what Jesus teaches.
