# Thomas' **Takeaways**

# God's Will - Part 2

1st Thessalonians 4:3. 1st Peter 2:15. 1st Thessalonians 5:18, and Romans 12:1-2 – did you look them up from last week? No? Well, go and do that right quick please, I'll still be here...got it? I asked a few questions last week concerning those passages and God's will, that I'm happy to give you my perspective on, which then hopefully helps answer the everlasting question of how to discern God's will for our lives:

• What are they explaining as God's will?

1<sup>st</sup> Thess. 4:3 explains the will of God as actions which lead to purity and sanctification, i.e. becoming holy like God. Romans 12 says that which is good and acceptable and perfect. 1<sup>st</sup> Peter 2 says that it's doing right which silences foolish people. And 1<sup>st</sup> Thess. 5 says it's to rejoice always, pray without ceasing, and to give thanks in everything. And those things are expounded in the context.

Why bring this up? Well, do you see any either/or choices? Nope...these passages all have to do with how you conduct yourself within choices, not what the choices are. Nor do these passages, nor anywhere else I read in Scripture, tell us that God will give us clear answers to *which* of our choices is best, but it does tell us that God tells us why you ought to choose one over the other:

- Which of these choices helps me be purer and more sanctified?
- Which of these seems more right with biblical principles • that tell me what is good and acceptable?
- Which of these helps me to rejoice, give thanks, and pray? The question then is "well what if the choices are

practically the same according to those criteria?" Does it ever occur to us that instead of God forcing us to make our own choices, that perhaps God is letting us make our own choices? That perhaps God knows by virtue of considering and choosing that that is how we can grow in God's will? That maybe free will isn't a curse, but something God wants us to exercise according to His wisdom and guidance?

We still will be faced with hard choices. But I'm less convinced that God wants us to make the *right* choice according to His will but is more concerned with how we make the best choices according to where we are in our spiritual walks. While for some this may seem like more stress, I have come to find it gives a sense of peace that life becomes less about right and wrong choices, but in freedom becomes how to be more like God. Grace to you.
