Thomas' Takeaways

Advertising

We all love good (read: funny or unusual) advertisements. Don't believe me? According to a 2019 survey, 20% of the people who watch the Superbowl say they watch it only for the commercials. Why? These are the best commercials of the year, and millions of dollars have gone into making and airing them...so they need to be memorable. Sadly, sometimes the content of the commercial is much more memorable than the product it is advertising...but I digress. We have all seen Superbowl commercials, but today I want to talk about some old advertisements.

In the early 1900's, a London newspaper had an advertisement that read: "Men wanted for hazardous darkness and constant danger. Safe return doubtful. Honor and recognition in case of success." This ad was placed by famous Arctic explorer Sir Ernest Shackleton. How many men responded to risk their lives for a chance of "honor and recognition in case of success"? Thousands.

London wasn't the only city asking people to do dangerous work. In the 1860's, a Missouri based stable put up fliers with the following announcement: "WANTED: Young, skinny, wiry fellows not over eighteen. Must be expert riders, willing to risk death daily. Orphans preferred. Wages: \$25/week." What was the job, you ask? To ride for the Pony Express, which, given how well known this operation still is today, must have proven popular with young men.

What if Jesus had put an ad for Christians in the local newspapers? In his book <u>Be Faithful</u>, Warden Wiersbe suggests it might read like this: "Men and women wanted for difficult task of helping to build My church. You will often be misunderstood, even by those working with you. You will face constant attack from an invisible enemy. You may not see the results of your labor, and your full reward will not come till after all your work is completed. It may cost you your home, your ambitions, even your life." It's a scary ad, but one that millions of people have responded to. Grace to you.

Because God's grace "overflowed" to all people (Romans 5:15-17) our love and generosity overflows to others (see also Romans 15:13, 2 Corinthians 4:15 and 2 Corinthians 8:2). Our English word "thankFUL" accurately expresses this Pauline concept. Because of the infinite gift of God's grace we are full of God's love, and it overflows to the lives of others. This week my soul is overflowing with thanks to God. Here are a few examples: 1) God has already forgiven me for every thing I've done and everything I will do in the future. 2) Peace that comes from knowing that God's love for me is based on his character, not my performance. 3) Peace that comes from knowing that no matter what happens in this life, I am assured a home with God in the next. 4) My brother is back in Oregon, so this will be our first Thanksgiving all together in a long time. 5) God has blessed me with a job where I get to share the good news with people on a daily basis. 6) UCC is the only Church of Christ Campus Ministry on the west coast with a house. Our building is a huge blessing. 7) Our church and Campus Ministry has been relatively unaffected by Covid-19. God answers prayers.
