

# The Hard Why Questions

As has been overstated most likely, this year has been challenging. COVID it seems has exacerbated any and every stressor, anxiety, division, and crack in our lives, and even for those who are less concerned about the health implications, has made everyday life at the very least incredibly inconvenient.

Yet, over the last few weeks, there has been an additional layer to life. Pain, suffering, and the end of life has been much more present for many, not just in our congregation. Things already difficult and taxing are made that much harder by the pandemic. I've been asked "why?" by multiple people in multiple contexts the last few weeks. Why this personal tragedy? Why this sickness? Why this situation? Why all this already on top of COVID? Just...why?

That God permits pain & suffering in His world continues to be among the top reasons people refuse to believe God exists. These questions have been reckoned with over the last few thousand years and have produced some good answers - if you'd like to have a Christologically ontological and epistemological conversation about the nature of suffering, I'm always game for it. But when it comes to people in the midst of pain & suffering, we must remember that those academic arguments mean about as much as those larger words I just used mean to most of you reading this – even if you understand it, it probably doesn't mean much. What does?

If you've ever experienced true, hard, deflating, heart-grinding pain, loss, or suffering you know the answers, but I offer them for us to consider all the same, and to invite your feedback if you wish for future articles. Those in pain often need the presence of friends, a listening ear, your quiet mouth, and a trusting shoulder to cry on. Presence speaks louder and better than any words, and there are no words you can say that will assuage immediate anguish, but you can help them process by listening. Grief and sorrow are vulnerable states; it is a sacred trust to be given to be cried to. Respect it and do not violate it.

This is a start, but one I hope we take to heart as we no doubt encounter more and more people who are hurting. We serve a God who understands what it is to suffer, and we can be the vessel through which God offers His unique comfort  $(2^{nd} \text{ Cor. } 1)$ . Grace to you.
