

Thomas' Takeaways

Celebrating Easter

In our tradition, there has always been a tension around celebrating certain days. This mainly comes from Galatians 4 in which Paul warns against celebrating "special days and months and seasons and years!" (Gal. 4:10). BUT Paul then also tells the Romans in 14:5 that some celebrate special days, others don't, and let each be convinced in their own mind. So, what's up, Paul?!!?

The difference lies in the reasons Paul was writing. The Romans were fighting and disfellowshipping each other as Christians over certain things that were based on opinion & preference, not directly tied to salvation or the understanding of who Christ is. Thus, he's writing towards the same conclusion he gave the Corinthians in Ch. 8, in that whether you eat meat or don't (or celebrate certain days) it's about how you treat your brother as you both are in Christ. The Galatians, on the other hand, were starting to be influenced by certain teachers who were teaching a Jesus+ salvation, or that Jesus plus doing these certain things will save you, some of them being celebrating certain days, months, seasons, & years to be saved, as in celebrating them was essential for salvation. To this doctrine does Paul call them fools for believing (Gal. 3:1).

So, is Easter worth celebrating as a 'special' day? Well, that's honestly up to you. But there are a few points worth considering. Firstly, it's what the whole of Christianity hinges on. Many other 'messiahs' have died, but only one has overcome death to help us to the same. Paul himself says if the resurrection isn't true then Christians are the most pitiable of people (1st Cor. 15:19). Secondly, it's one of the most obvious and tangible reminders of what new life truly is – not just a teaching, belief, or a memory, but truly new, eternal life rising from death by the power of God, and this power you have as well (Romans 8:11). Thirdly, it's a reminder of what Christianity is, not just an event but a journey – Christ rose, but wasn't and isn't done with the world or us yet, but it was the start. And finally, no matter who celebrates it, from Resurrection day on, the world was never the same. So, while celebrating the day (or not) won't save you or condemn you, it does sound pretty special to me. Happy Easter, and grace to you!

This week we studied the story of Jesus cleansing the leper (Matthew 8:1-4). Interestingly enough, I experienced flaky skin this week in the form of a badly sunburned face. Don't get me wrong, a sunburn is not nearly as bad as leprosy, but it made me realize some things this guy must have been going through: 1) When you've got peeling skin on your face, you don't want to be around people. This week it took all the courage I had to go on campus to recruit students. 2) People treat you differently when there is something wrong with your face. When people see you they will either avoid you or show you a sort of disgusted compassion (oh, you poor thing, were you out in the sun too much?). No matter what their attitude, they can't help looking at your ugliness. 3) The physical pain is intense! It's hard to sleep or focus on your work.

My sunburn was only temporary and a result of my own carelessness. Can you imagine if you contracted a permanent skin disease through no fault of your own? How would that affect your relationship with God and others? Would you be more reclusive, lonely and depressed? Would you have lower self confidence? Would you question God's love for you? This makes this story all the more amazing. This guy had the guts to break the law and approach Jesus, and Jesus had the guts to break the law to heal him. But it wasn't really breaking the intent of the law because both Jesus and the Leper knew Jesus was able to take our illnesses and carry our diseases (Matthew 8:17).
