

A Note From Mark Johnson

Continued spiritual growth is the hallmark of a disciple of Christ. Do you ever wonder if you're growing spiritually? In Matthew 13 Jesus uses the Parable of the Sower and the different kinds of soil to depict what it means to be growing spiritually. There are four kinds of soils described. The first three are inhospitable for plant growth and bearing fruit. These are: 1) the path (compacted and hardthe word is easily snatched away by the evil one), 2) rocky places (very little soil – no place to root and the word guickly withers), thorns (the weeds-the worries of life and deceitfulness of wealth choke the life out of the word). It's the fourth one, the seed that falls on "good soil" that bears fruit and produces an abundant crop (v. 8). In verse 23 Jesus explains what this means "But the seed falling on good soil refers to someone who hears the word and understands it. This is the one who produces a crop, yielding a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown." Jesus expects his followers to do more than just hear the word, He expects us to bear fruit! We need to ask ourselves "Am I bearing fruit?" If the answer is "Yes", rejoice for you are doing what Jesus expects you to be doing! If the answer is "No", then we need to move beyond just hearing the word, we also need to be doing what it says. If you answered "No", what do you need to be doing differently now to begin bearing fruit for the Kingdom? Food (fruit) for thought.
