

"I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people" (Luke 2:11).

What comes to mind when you think of Christmas? For me, I think of a time of "comfort and joy" (as "God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen" describes). It's a time to watch feel good Christmas comedies, sit around the fire drinking hot coco, eat delicious, heavily, carbohydrated foods and watch my waste line gradually become equatorial. What a happy, pudgy, snuggly, comfy holiday, right?

However, the word "comfort" is nowhere in the Christmas story. Good news, yes. Great joy, yes. A savior is born, yes. But comfort, no. Why? Well, the first Christmas was not comfortable.
