3 years ago, I went on The Kindness Walk with a blind man. We walked from Long Beach, CA to Las Vegas, NV. My brother and I were his guides. God showed up in so many ways during that 30 day, 450 mile walk. Our longest uphill climb was ONLY 9 miles. We walked through many desert towns and through Death Valley. It was challenging, but I wouldn't trade the experiences we had and lessons we learned for anything!

We had run low on meat for our sandwiches we ate each day for lunch, and we were too far away from any store to buy more. My brother had wisely brought cans of tuna and chicken for when we ran out of sandwich fixin's, but he forgot about the most important utensil: a can opener. When we ran out of meat we had to get creative with the food we had left to feed ourselves until we got closer to a town. We jokingly would remind my brother, "If only we had a can opener".

One night around 11 pm, Mother Nature had called, so I left our 32' motor home to tend to my needs. As I headed back, I walked rather briskly with my flashlight shining so I wouldn't be surprised by any desert critters. As I walked past a bush (I now call it the "burning bush"), the light from my flashlight braised across something shiny which caused me to go back to the bush....underneath the edge of that "burning bush" was a bright, shiny, almost brand spanking new hand held can opener. Yes, God definitely showed up! The next day, those tuna sandwiches never tasted better and to this day, every time I eat a tuna Sandwich, I am reminded of how abundantly God provides for us.
