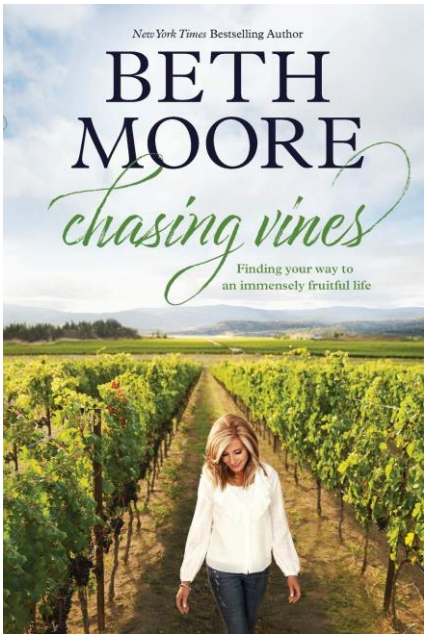

From The Desk of

My work week usually consists of listening to something as I type away at my desk. It's a constant stream of books on tape, scripture, music, news, and podcasts. Something I noticed early on was the need, at the very least, to balance what I was consuming. Culture is infused in all but scripture. Scripture remains the Holy Word of God. The unadulterated truth throughout all history. It was with God in the beginning (John 1:1-18). It is with us now, if we read it, if we let it guide us. If you are in the Word, you can hold up anything next to it. Cast it off if it does not measure up.

As I did this over the last two years, I found myself less entertained in the fake realities and hollowness of secular "entertainment." The world calls it entertainment. Are we entertained? The gratuitous amount of drama, explicit content, mocking of God or false portrayal of Him, is not entertainment. The embracement of personal truth and wild self expression has become more extreme. God calls us to be different. God calls us to Him in a place so different that He says the world will hate us (John 15:18-25). We are made in His image (Gen.1:27), we have denied ourselves and taken up the cross. By participating in His death, burial, and resurrection, and becoming one body, we do not cling to self identity. Our identity is in Christ (Romans 12:3-8, Eph. 2:11-22, Eph. 4:4-5). Let me tell you, that yoke is light. The world's progressions will continue and will weigh people down, but the Word remains the same, and we are to remain in the Word. Let that be a reminder and a comfort.

As we approach Easter and we dwell on the sacrifice that Christ died on the cross for the forgiveness of sins, take that truth to heart. This is the truth that sets us free. Rest in that peace, pray over one another, and spend time with God. Meet people in their struggles, share the good news that they can die to self, take up the cross and follow Him and live in Truth. Be always ready to give an account of why you believe, to be that light to others in the darkness.

Do it with grace and love, and as importantly, truth (Eph. 4:14-16).
