From The Desk of Chris Jensen

Recently Rolland and Gregg did a two-part sermon series on the devastating impact of addiction and the hope we have in our mighty God to save. For some the mere mention of the things that lead to addiction would be a taboo topic. I appreciate the willingness and courage of Rolland and Gregg to speak truth and point to God's resurrection power to save when Satan wants to keep such things in the shadows. It's always interesting how God uses one truth to teach me another. In the weeks since this two-part series God has caused a couple of thoughts to percolate within me:

First, I want to be a part of a faith community that has the willingness and the courage to step out of the shadows and "be real" with our weaknesses/failures, and to proclaim that God's resurrection power will transform and renew us and bring us from death to life! I want God's Spirit to work within me, maturing my faith and helping me to be transparent, vulnerable, and accepting of others, and at all times and in all possible ways pointing to our Awesome God!

Second, I've been contemplating my needs, my longings, and my cravings. I do not want to be ruled by these things, rather I want Christ on the throne of my life. However I've been wondering, is it possible that God uses these things to serve a useful purpose, a higher purpose, a godly purpose in my life?

Yes! Hear the words of the Psalmists:

- As the deer longs for streams of water, so I long for you, O God. Psalm 42: 1
- O God, you are my God; I earnestly search for you. My soul thirsts for you; my whole body longs for you in this parched and weary land where there is no water. Psalm 63: 1
- I long for the Lord more than sentries long for the dawn, yes, more than sentries long for dawn. Psalm 130:

Like the Psalmist I recognize that

- every need points to my need for God,
- every longing is the cry of my inmost soul which yearns for my Lord, and
- every time those familiar cravings recur I am reminded that nothing satisfies like my Savior.
