From The Desk Of Misty Freeman

This week, James and I got to dog sit for a delightful golden Bichon named Luna. The joy she brought simply by being there made me reflect on the idea of companionship. By companionship, I mean being together with others, spending time in each other's presence, in the good times and the bad. It seems to me that humans are made for companionship—and not just of the canine variety. In the book of Genesis, chapters 1 and 2, we read about God's creation. As He surveys everything He has made, He sees that it is good...until chapter 2, verse 18, when God declares that it is *not* good for Adam to be alone. God creates Eve, and the two humans make a life together. In the year 2022, we are more connected than ever through our phones and devices. We have all the Facebook friends and Instagram followers, yet many of us are lonely. A 2021 Harvard study¹ found that 36% of adults reported feeling lonely often or all the time, and another 37% reported feeling lonely occasionally. Like Adam, it seems that it is not good for us to be alone either. I wonder if the pattern God offers for companionship could be the solution for us. Consider these companions and how they serve as a model for us:

- David and Jonathan (beginning in 1 Samuel 18): "the soul of Jonathan was knit to the soul of David..." and "Jonathan made a covenant with David because he loved him as himself." Throughout the story, the two face serious challenges to their friendship, including Jonathan's father seeking to kill David, yet they showed up for each other, protected each other, and cared for each other.
- Ruth and Naomi (the book of Ruth, especially chapter 2): the two
 had been brought together as daughter- and mother-in-law, yet after
 the death of Ruth's husband, she vowed not to leave Naomi, and
 stayed with her instead of leaving to find another husband. Both
 were richly blessed through their relationship.
- Jesus and John (the gospels, especially the book of John): these two were together through Jesus' ministry and clearly had a close relationship, as John refers to himself as "the disciple whom Jesus loved." I like to imagine that in the midst of all the teaching and traveling and stress of going against the religious authorities, John was someone Jesus could relax around, recline at the table with, and be Himself.

We also see a pattern for companionship in 1 Corinthians 13, where the author describes agape love, which is *intentional* love—an act of will and sacrifice. It tells us that love "bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, and endures all things. Love never fails."

Humans want companions like these, don't we? We want someone to come alongside us in the fun times and the hard stuff. To make a commitment to us that they will not leave us or betray us. We want to be able to be ourselves and know that our companion will love us, not in spite of who we are, but because of it.

I wonder if the first step is to become a companion ourselves. Perhaps as we step out and learn what it means to agape love another person, show up and simply be there with them, we will gain a companion as well. I pray that God will give each of us opportunities to be a companion to someone this week, and that we will be blessed as we step out in faith to try.

Holy Lord, please open our eyes to the companionship you have planned for us. Help us to be brave and step out in faith. And please bless our relationships richly. In Jesus' name, Amen.
