From The Desk Of Jennifer House Zealous

Do you ever feel like you’re working your tail off but not making a bit of difference?

As I was reading through the book of Nehemiah, I came across a word that jumped off the page at me: **ZEALOUSLY**. In chapter 3, Nehemiah was listing people who helped repair the temple -- not an exciting job, I’m sure! Each person was listed as having “made repairs” or “repaired another section”, but Baruch, the son of Zabbai was listed as having, “*ZEALOUSLY repaired another section*”.

The word, “zealously” means: *devoted, diligent, enthusiastic, eager, and passionate*. Repairing the temple would have been exceptionally hard work for everyone involved. It was an important enough job that people received recognition for it by being mentioned in God’s word, yet the adverb, “*zealously*” was only used to describe Baruch’s work. So, you can imagine the kind of impression that Baruch must have made on Nehemiah (or God,) in order for his service to be mentioned in such an honorary fashion.

Sometimes we don't feel like the work we do has any significance, but God's Word tells us:

**Colossians 3:23-24:** “*Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving.*”

I pray that Baruch’s example will inspire us this week, so that whatever we do, whether big or small, we will do it **ZEALOUSLY** for the Lord.

He and Bhavia cooked some great Indian food and then we had a discussion comparing the teachings of Jesus and Gandhi. We focused on giving your life for others, non-retaliation and the centrality of love (Gandhi’s teaching on these three topics was deeply inspired by Jesus). This was a very creative idea on Sai’s part. We were able to pack UCC with 25 non-Christians (many of them Indians), build common ground and present the words of Jesus to them. At the end of the night, we said, “if you liked this discussion, come Tuesday night, where we do this exact same thing, minus the Gandhi quotes.” It was a way to gradually transition our “social event only” group into our Bible study group. Very creative on Sai’s part.
