
From The Desk Of Maria Zhang


So many Bible verses tell us how big our God is. "Great is our Lord, and abundant in power; his understanding is beyond measure." (Ps 147:5). "Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the creator of the ends of the Earth. He does not faint or grow weary; His understanding is unsearchable." (Is 40:28). "Behold, I am the Lord, the God of all flesh. Is anything too hard for me?" (Jer 32:27).

Yet, why do we as humans try to shelter or downplay Him? We know Jesus has changed our lives for the better, but we worry about sharing Jesus with other people, because what if He doesn't stand up to their questions? We are taught from a young age that faith is important (AND IT IS!), but having faith doesn't mean things can't cause us to doubt for a moment. Yet, we don't voice those doubts, because what if they can't be answered? When something awful happens, it is common to hear the phrase "All we can do is pray", yet it is through prayer we have the greatest power to make a difference.

I have several family members and friends going through hard times, and it is common for them to take their frustrations out on God. I found myself thinking "I wish they wouldn't take their frustration out on God; What if He gets hurt?" God quickly reminded me that He can stand up to their complaints much better than I can, and that it is my job to share His love with them so He can heal their hearts and help them walk through this hard life. God is BIG. He is big enough to answer our questions, our doubts, and our insecurities.

"When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars which you have set in place, what is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him?" (Ps 8:3-4).

I'm out at Camp Yamhill this week. Please keep me in your prayers. I am preaching two sermons to the teens, and my scripture is John 14:1-14. The first one will be titled, "The Destination: Our Father's House." The second is "The Way, The Truth and The Life." I'll give you a brief summary of the first one. John 14:2 is my favorite description of eternal life. Jesus says, "In my Father's house there are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you." Most other Biblical writers describe heaven as a perfect/beautiful city with pearly gates, a crystal sea, streets of gold, precious stones and lots of symbolic temple imagery. While these descriptions are also very important, John simplifies things and reminds us of the most important reason why we want to go to heaven—we will be fully reunited with God and Jesus. We will live under his roof, where we can experience his love fully with no sin or distractions. As John says later, "Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent" (Jn 17:3). Our motivation to live the Christian life comes not from a desire for materialistic paradise, but from our deep love for God, and our longing to be with him.

Also pray for the teens and my ability to counsel them well. In the past 3 years, we have had to send students home every year for serious behavioral issues. A few struggling teens have made things miserable for the counselors. My prayer is that this year, God would give these struggling teens the self control to live his way on the first night of camp—they would integrate into the Christian lifestyle immediately.
