On Friday July 28th, Circle is holding a heart clinic. We are hosting a Lifeline screening event for people in the Corvallis community. People can choose to receive a carotid artery screening, peripheral arterial disease screening, abdominal aortic aneurism screening, atrial fibrillation screening, or all four. These screenings provide peace of mind or early detection.

These screens are important, and they could help save the lives of at risk people in our families, church, or community. Please help us spread the word about this upcoming screening, and talk to Maria if you would like to volunteer to help with the screening at the church.

If you are interested in any of the screenings, pick up one of the pink flyers in the foyer. Online registration for appointments is required, so if you want to make an appointment, please do so as soon as possible. You can choose which screenings you want, or you can receive all 4 screenings. Medicare is not accepted, insurance is not required, and a 50% discount is available for church members, making all 4 screenings \$149.

I'm out at Camp Yamhill this week. Please keep me in your prayers. I am preaching two sermons to the teens, and my scripture is John 14:1-14. The first one will be titled, "The Destination: Our Father's House." The second is "The Way, The Truth and The Life." I'll give you a brief summary of the first one. John 14:2 is my favorite description of eternal life. Jesus says, "In my Father's house there are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you." Most other Biblical writers describe heaven as a perfect/beautiful city with pearly gates, a crystal sea, streets of gold, precious stones and lots of symbolic temple imagery. While these descriptions are also very important, John simplifies things and reminds us of the most important reason why we want to go to heaven—we will be fully reunited with God and Jesus. We will live under his roof, where we can experience his love fully with no sin or distractions. As John says later, "Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent" (Jn 17:3). Our motivation to live the Christian life comes not from a desire for materialistic paradise, but from our deep love for God, and our longing to be with him.

Also pray for the teens and my ability to counsel them well. In the past 3 years, we have had to send students home every year for serious behavioral issues. A few struggling teens have made things miserable for the counselors. My prayer is that this year, God would give these struggling teens the self control to live his way on the first night of camp—they would integrate into the Christian lifestyle immediately.
