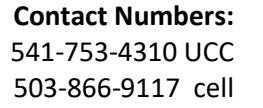

(Ephesians 5:8-20, NIV). "8 For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light 9 (for the fruit of the light consists in all goodness, righteousness and truth) 10 and find out what pleases the Lord. 11 Have nothing to do with the fruitless deeds of darkness, but rather expose them. 12 It is shameful even to mention what the disobedient do in secret. 13 But everything exposed by the light becomes visible—and everything that is illuminated becomes a light. 14 This is why it is said: "Wake up, sleeper, rise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you." 15 Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil. 17 Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is. 18 Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit, 19 speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, 20 always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." This is the entire passage, which is included for importance of context for the part that I have found so true lately. You have the world and all its distractions and devolvement, and scripture calls us to "instead be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the father for everything, in the Lord Jesus Christ." This has been transformative in my life for the last 5 years since I had taken up the KLOVE challenge of only listening to Christian music for 30 days straight. Fast forward to today and I have held on to a peace and joy that's filled me over the time of stay-at-home orders and violence and politics. If I'm feeling negative or stressed I pray and I put my Christian playlist on the stereo at home throughout the day. I've woken up most mornings with a song in my heart, much to my surprise and comfort. Many days, my son walks around pulling out all his toys singing "God is with us" (For King & Country), which I can't tell you how much that fills my heart. And when we meet with each other in the spirit on Sundays, and join our voices together, I always find that special, for all the years that I grew up in this church. It's like a fellowship/spiritual hug with each other and the Lord. Thank you to all the members of the body for joining together on Sundays and throughout the week. Be encouraged and loved and full of praise.
