

I was blessed to grow up in a wonderful Christian home with loving parents—my upbringing was one in a million. However, I don't think I really understood the grace of God until I was 35 years old. In my young life, I think the Grace of God was a metaphorical picture of Jesus that hung above our dinner table. We loved that picture, we talked about that picture—you could even say that picture was the centerpiece of our home. But practically speaking, it hung on the wall and was rarely used. What do I mean? Practically in my day to day life I lived by this formula: Hard work + hard study + church attendance + prayer + discipline = eternal salvation and worldly success.

This lead to perfectionism and high anxiety. Three years ago, each fall I would be hit with immense anxiety and chest pains because I thought, "If I don't work/study/pray like crazy and live a perfect lifestyle, no one is going to come to Jesus, and this ministry/church will die." I've finally realized that all good things are a gift from God. He can keep this ministry alive with or without me. I'm not going to be perfect, but he loves me as I am. I think I'm finally learning to take the grace of God down off the wall and start sharing it at the table. As fall stress ramps up, I hope you'll join me.
