Jerry Smith came to talk with me last Wednesday about baptism. Jerry had been baptized into the LDS church at age 17. Years later, when Jerry and Susan began attending Circle, he had considered himself "already baptized." However, as he studied Scripture further over many years, Jerry reported feeling uneasy as he read about the "one baptism" of Ephesians 4:5. He wondered about those in Acts 19:1-7 who had once been baptized "into John's baptism" who were re-baptized "in the name of the Lord Jesus." Jerry expressed a growing concern that he ought to be re-baptized simply into the name of Jesus Christ rather than into the LDS church. In our conversation, Jerry and I read through Romans 6:1-11 and 1 Peter 3:18-22 about the purpose and function of baptism. As our discussion came to a close, I simply asked Jerry what he wanted to do. He said he wanted to be baptized immediately. So, like Phillip and the Ethiopian in Acts 8, we proceeded immediately to the nearest water (the church baptistry, in our case). Jerry confessed his convicted faith in Jesus as he was baptized into Jesus' name for the forgiveness of his sins. Jerry reported feeling great joy and peace afterward. He hopes others will be encouraged by his experience. If you ever have questions about spiritual matters, I will always make myself available to explore God's Word with you. -Wes
